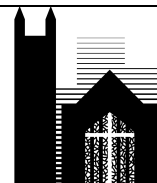

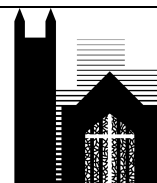

MINI-CONCERT PERFORMER BIOGRAPHIES

ANDREW SCHAEFFER has just completed his Sophomore year at St. Olaf College as a church music major where he is an organ student of Dr. John Ferguson. He also serves as the Assistant Organist and Church Music Scholar at All Saints Lutheran Church in Minnetonka, Minnesota. Prior to that appointment, Andrew served as the organist and worship coordinator at Wilmette Lutheran Church in Wilmette, Illinois. In December 2008, Andrew appeared as organist for the National Lutheran Choir's Christmas Festival, held annually at the Basilica of St. Mary, Minneapolis and Christ Church Cathedral, St. Louis. As a Chicago resident, Andrew and his family attend St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Park Ridge, Illinois.

CAROLYN DIAMOND is active as a pianist, pipe organist, and church clinician and performs regularly in the metro areas of New York and Minnesota. A frequent performer at the TCU/Van Cliburn Institute, she was a winner of the 2003 Piano Concerto Competition, performing with the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra. Diamond currently serves as Principal Organist at Mount Calvary Lutheran Church in Excelsior, Minnesota and Staff Musician at Central Lutheran Church in Minneapolis.

RÄNDEL WOLFE is the Director of Music and the Arts at the historic Trinity Lutheran Church—a Federal Landmark worshipping in the City of Reading since 1751. Dr. Wolfe holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Music from California Lutheran University, a Master of Sacred Music Degree from Wittenberg University, in Springfield, Ohio, and a Doctorate of Musical Arts from the University of Kansas in both Organ Performance and Choral Conducting.

In addition to his duties at "Old Trinity," Dr. Wolfe is currently a member of the acclaimed Wheatland Chorale and serves as a Lecturer at Alvernia University. Dr. Wolfe has been a certified *Carillonneur* member of the North American Guild of Carillonneurs since 1999. Dr. Wolfe also serves on the Board of the Royal School of Church Music in America.

NATIONAL LUTHERAN CHOIR "You Shall Have a Song"

Central and the National Lutheran Choir invite you to this free hymn festival.

"You Shall Have a Song" is the theme for a hymn festival led by the National Lutheran Choir, David Cherwien director and organist. Join the choir in thunderous singing of hymns to God in this magnificent space, deepened by reflections offered by hymnist and poet Susan Palo Cherwien. Hymns from a wide representation of time, space and style will be sung with assistance from a variety of instruments including the 107-rank Casavant pipe organ, piano and drums. The choir will also sing choral literature by Maurice Duruflé, Jean Langlais, Pavel Chesnokov, Randall Thompson, F. Melius Christiansen and Kevin Siegfried.



The National Lutheran Choir, under the direction of David Cherwien, performs literature from the entire spectrum of sacred choral music, with and without instrumental accompaniment, and in was the recipient of the 2007 Margaret Hillis Award for Choral Excellence from Chorus America and the 2007 Wittenberg Award from the Luther Institute. The choir was founded in 1986 by Dr. Larry Fleming.

Members of the National Lutheran Choir are drawn from the Minneapolis/St. Paul area and beyond for weekly rehearsals and local and national performances. The ensemble presents a choral works in concert and worship settings, leads workshops in choral techniques, hymnody and liturgy, commissions and publishes new compositions, and broadcasts and records extensively. DAVID CHERWIEN, artistic director

Dr. Cherwien has served the Lutheran Church as a full time musician for over 20 years in the Twin Cities, Chicago, Seattle and Berlin, Germany. He has also served on the faculty at Gustavus Adolphus and Elmhurst Colleges. He holds degrees in Organ Performance, Theory and Composition, and Choral Music Education, and has studied in Berlin, and Aix-en-Provence, France. Cherwien's specialty and passion is in congregational song, with an improvisational/creative approach in order to encourage meaningful and vibrant participation. His ministry spreads across the country through his frequent hymn festivals, workshops, guest appearances, and over 100 musical publications.
