It is with great sadness that we share news of the passing of LaVerne T. Bergan at the age of 95.


LaVerne was born in Madison Township, Iowa on October 3, 1927, to Carl and Mabel (Kjos) Bergan of Ridgeway, Iowa. He graduated from Ridgeway High School in 1947 and attended Bradley University in Peoria, Illinois and Iowa State in Ames, Iowa. In 1953, LaVerne joined the Special Category Army Personnel with Air Force (SCARPWAF) (1953 - 1955) and served in the Korean War. During his time in the service, he


learned skills that he used for the rest of his working career as a carpenter. He was a longstanding member (1956-present) of the North Central States Carpenters Union, Local 322.

He was a longtime member of Central Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, where he met and married Lois Larson from Lanesboro, Minnesota on June 15, 1972.
