David Chester Johnson, born in Grand Rapids, Minnesota, to Chester and Olga (Resnick) Johnson on January 21, 1933, has died in Minneapolis on July 5, 2025.

He graduated from Grand Rapids High School in 1950, Gustavus Adolphus College in 1954, and received an M.A., Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of Iowa in 1956 and 1959. He and Gustavus classmate Jean Lunnis of Minneapolis

were married in 1955. They became the parents of Stephen, Andrew and Jennifer.

His career includes founding the Department of Sociology at Luther College, where he taught from 1957-1969, East Stroudsburg University of Pennsylvania Dean of Arts and Sciences 1969-1976, St. Cloud State University Vice President for Academic Affairs 1976-1983, Gustavus Adolphus College Dean of the College 1983-1990, and Chancellor of the University of Minnesota Morris (UMM) 1990-1998.

During his career, he was the recipient of a National Science Foundation Science Faculty Fellowship to the Norwegian Institute for Alcohol Research in Oslo, a Kennedy Fellowship for research on immigration to Sweden, and the presidency of the Elder Learning Institute (now Osher Lifelong Learning Institute). He and Jean teamed with Luther colleagues and Norwegian friends to lead seven hiking groups in Norway and Sweden and later three such trips in Romania's Transylvanian mountains. He called those treks "liberal arts on the hoof" and "spartan days and decadent nights". In retirement, he has served as consultant to the international offices in the universities of Oslo, Bergen, and Tromso in Norway, Malmo and Kristianstad in Sweden, and Tampere in Finland as well as the Fulbright offices in Oslo and Helsinki.


