## + Lois Nesseth

1936 - 2025



Lois Karen Nesseth, 89, was born in Detroit, Michigan and died peacefully in Minneapolis, Minnesota surrounded by the love of her family.

She grew up alongside her four brothers in a hardworking family that first made its way in Detroit's auto and plastering industries before starting a farm in Michigan's Eastern Upper Peninsula. Lois held warm memories of those years, when long hard days were balanced by the simple joys of family life. From an early age she loved music, especially the piano, and she carried

that passion for classical playing throughout her life. After graduating from St. Olaf College, she returned to the Upper Peninsula, where she married and began her career as a teacher and as an extension agent—writing a newspaper column and guiding farm families in food preparation, nutrition, and family care.

In the 1970s, her brothers launched a manufacturing business, and within a few years they decided to move to Wisconsin to be closer to more of the dairy farms who would purchase their equipment. Lois relocated to Barron, Wisconsin with her three boys and 20 other members of the Nesseth family. The move was a true family effort, requiring 23 trips with a single semitruck to transport all of the households and the equipment.

Lois raised her sons through their formative years in Barron before life's opportunities and family needs led her to new chapters in Northfield, Minnesota, Salt Lake City, Utah, Big Sky, Montana, and eventually back to Wisconsin and Minnesota. She carried with her a steadfast belief that every move, every change, held the promise of a new beginning—if only one had the courage to embrace it.


Lois was a proud and devoted mother to her three sons—Kris (Carolyn) Karsell, Hans (Kelly) Kabat, and Lars (Allison) Nesseth. Nothing brought her greater joy than her six granddaughters: Catherine (Zachary) and Emma, daughters of Kris and Carolyn; Kate and Sara Pearl, daughters of

Hans and Kelly; and Liv and Rivers, daughters of Lars and Allison. Each was a bright light in her life, and she cherished them dearly.

Serving meals—for one guest or many—was her favorite undertaking, when she overfilled her many dishes and bowls with bounty from her urban garden and always served dessert. In addition to her garden, Lois will be remembered for poetic emails and writings, kitchen cupboards papered with family photos, her special way with children, beloved chicken and dumplings recipe, and her love for dogs.

She is survived by her brother, Clinton (Connie) Nesseth, and many nieces and nephews.

Lois joins in peace her parents, Clifford Bryce and Pearl Viola, and her brothers Bryce, Dennis, and Raymond. Rest eternal grant her, O Lord; and let light perpetual shine upon them all.
