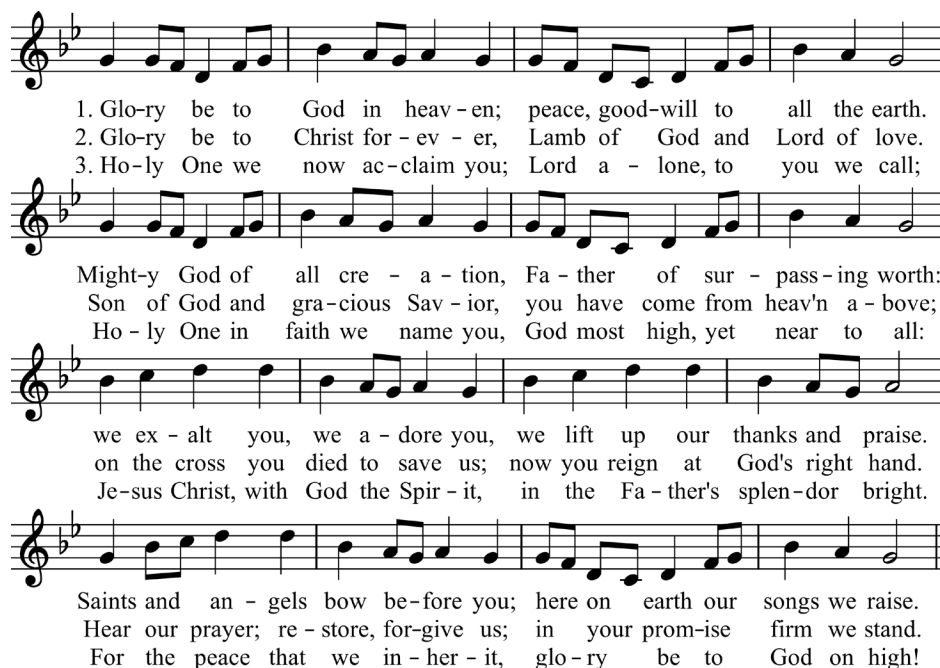

FIRST READING

Ezekiel 33:7-11

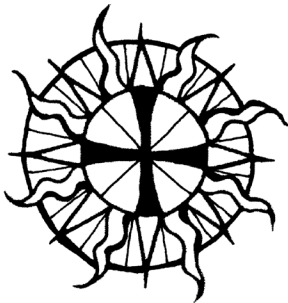

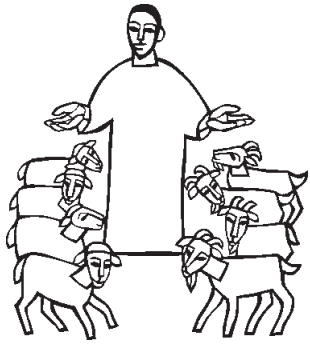

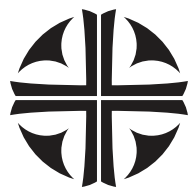
